Love is All You Need: 9/27 - Running Time of 116 minutes - Philip, an Englishman living in Denmark, is a lonely, middle-aged widower and estranged single father. Ida is a Danish hairdresser, recuperating from a long bout of illness, who's just been left by her husband for a younger woman. The fates of these two bruised souls are about to intertwine as they embark on a trip to Italy to attend the wedding of Patrick and Astrid, Philip's son and Ida's daughter.

**La Grande Seduction**: 10/25 - Running Time of 109 minutes - St. Marie-La-Mauderne is a tiny fishing village in what some may call the middle of nowhere. For eight years the locals have stood in line for weekly welfare checks. Then, one day, a chance at salvation comes along when a small company wants to build a factory on the island but only if a full-time doctor lives in St. Marie. The situation seems hopeless until a young doctor in Montreal finds himself on a boat to the faraway village. But how to convince handsome, young, urbane Dr. Lewis to stay in this dreary little spot on the map? The answer lies in a bit of seduction and funny business.

**Shower:** 11/15 - Running Time of 94 minutes - When the eldest son returns to his family in Beijing to help care for his mentally handicapped younger brother, he is forced to face up to the reality that the life he remembers in China is being slowly wiped away from memory by the machinations of modernity.

#### Roe v. Wade: Where Are We Now? Tuesday, June 27 10:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.

This Supreme Court decision stands today as the most controversial landmark case in modern history. It's been around for over forty years and is still a hot button topic. There was a reason why Katie Couric asked Sarah Palin to name any Supreme Court decision except Roe v. Wade during that now famous interview. But, what was the Supreme Court case that preceded it that led the way to Roe? What was the real reason that nine male justices made this landmark decision? It really had nothing to do with women's rights. But, what did influence them? Whatever happened to Jane Roe whose real name was Norma McCorvey? The answers to these questions will fascinate you and give you a whole new perspective about the decision that has divided a country.

Facilitator: Barbara Blumberg is a graduate of Towson University with a B.S. in Education. She taught for two years in BCPS, 25 years at Beth Tfiloh day school, has been an adjunct faculty member at various CCBC campuses and has taught at many lifelong learning programs including Osher, Renaissance, Food for Thought, Kaleidoscope, The Lecture Group, Western Howard County Senior Center, Friends of the Pikesville Library and North Oaks Retirement Community.



# Living in a Trump World Tuesdays, September 5, 12, 19, 26 10:30 a.m. - noon

We will be comparing and contrasting the first seven plus months of the Trump presidency with the two plus years of governorship of Larry Hogan. How do their approaches differ? How are they succeeding? What lies ahead for each of them in the 2018 elections? Issues will include the future of health care, tax reform, federal/state budget deficits, foreign policy (Europe, the Middle East, China, Mexico), immigration, relationships with the media, domestic agendas and other controversies that emerge by then. The sessions will seek to illuminate what's really going on and provide us with factual information that will allow us to gain a broader perspective on these important matters.





# The History of Advertising: 15 Ads That Changed the Way We Live Tuesdays, October 3, 10, 17, 24 10:30 a.m. - noon

What was the first commodity or product ever sold? This course will explore the history of advertising beginning with P.T. Barnum, the first man to promote his business on a national and international level. We'll learn about products that are related to our body hygiene and about cigarettes that were originally designed for women but became the most popular cigarettes ever sold and represented that most masculine of men: the cowboy! The products we discuss will be those that changed our lifestyles due to the creative genius of ad men in the 20th Century. We'll view shocking racist and misogynistic ads prevalent through the 50s and 60s. The course will include music, jingles, celebrities, athletes and models. Finally, we will view classic, influential, vintage TV commercials that we'll recall, but we will view them differently in the bright light of the 21st Century.
