PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Congregants,

I am very pleased to announce that Rabbi David Katz will be joining us in July as our next Rabbi. (See separate announcement in *The Connection*).

In early April, I had the opportunity and pleasure to attend the URJ Scheidt Seminar for incoming or recently elected temple presidents. This was a wonderful learning experience about what it takes to be the president of a congregation and allowed me to network with 87 other temple presidents. One of the key take-aways from the Seminar was learning more about the resources available to us through the URJ. We have already arranged for Amy Asin, URJ Vice President/Director of Strengthening Congregations, to come meet with our Board of Trustees on June 11.

Over the past several months, we have made much progress in our discussions with Temple Oheb Shalom regarding a possible merger of the two congregations. I would like to take this opportunity to publicly thank those individuals representing Har Sinai Congregation on the Joint Task Force. Each of them has devoted many hours of time to bringing the merger discussions forward and to presenting the progress from these discussions to the congregation last week. I also wanted to thank everyone who attended the Town Hall meeting. A special thanks to Rabbi Floyd Herman for sharing his thoughts on the merger with the congregation.

As noted at the meeting, one of the open issues was the resolution of the dispute with Rabbi Fink. As you are all hopefully aware, that dispute has now been settled, which was important for the merger to move ahead, and we can now put this issue behind us.

Further, as indicated at the Town Hall Meeting, the next step is to have both Boards of Trustees approve a Letter of Intent (LOI) to merge. It is planned that this will happen on May 14. Once the LOI is approved by the Boards, Vicki Spira, President of Temple Oheb Shalom, and I will sign the LOI to allow the merger process to move to the next step.

Separate from the merger discussions, we have also been working with Temple Oheb Shalom to have joint services once again during the summer months. The final details are being worked out and will be announced shortly.

Please remember to mark your calendars for the upcoming Annual Meeting, which is scheduled for Sunday, May 19 at 9:30 a.m. We will be electing new officers and trustees, approving the 2019-2020 budget, and most importantly voting to approve the hiring of Rabbi Katz.

NEW INTERIM RABBI

Over the last several months, our Rabbi Search Committee, led by Debbi Jacobs, has done an outstanding job in bringing several candidates to meet with us as part of the selection process. We are extremely pleased to announce that Rabbi David Katz will accept our offer to become our next Rabbi pending the approval of our Congregation at the Annual Meeting on May 19.



Rabbi David Katz

Rabbi David Katz was born in Rochester, New York. He studied theatre at Northwestern University where he received his Bachelor of Science and Master of Arts degrees. At Hebrew Union College – Jewish Institute of Religion he was granted his Master’s of Hebrew Letters and Master of Arts in Hebrew Education. He was ordained in 1981, became an RJE (Reform Jewish Educator), and was awarded the degree of Doctor of Divinity in 2006. Rabbi Katz brought innovative programming and the highest standards of education to Temple Israel of Staten Island, where he served as spiritual leader for 16 years. During his tenure the congregation became known as a leader in interfaith relations. Rabbi Katz was a Scholar in Residence at Wagner College and also served on the faculty at St. John’s University. He has served congregations as an Interim Rabbi in Pleasanton, CA, Pittsburgh, PA, Armonk, NY, Johns Creek, GA, Stony Brook, NY and most recently at Temple B’nai Or in Morristown, NJ.

Rabbi Katz helped conceive and edit many of the Reform movement’s liturgical texts, including its official siddur, *Mishkan T’filah*. He has written numerous articles and is the co-editor of *Reading Between the Lines: New Stories from the Bible*.

Rabbi Katz comes to Har Sinai Congregation with his wife, Nancy, a painter and ceramic artist. They have two children. Emily is the Communications Director for French philosopher/political activist Bernard-Henri Levi and Benjamin is a professional harpsichordist.



RABBI JOSEPH'S MESSAGE

As May began, I travelled to New York to receive my Doctorate of Divinity, Honoris Causa, from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, our Reform Jewish seminary that trains many of the Jewish professionals of our Reform Movement. This honorary doctorate acknowledges the 25 years that I have served the Jewish community as a rabbi. The journey for me has been one of twists and turns. If you had asked me 25 ago what my rabbinate would look like, I would be serving a Jewish community in Australia, creating a vibrant Progressive Judaism down-under! But like many of you, life does not turn out how we imagine.

Looking back on 25 years, I thank God for the incredible experiences that I have had serving very diverse synagogues and constituencies. Every community – Melbourne (Australia), New Jersey, Florida, Virginia, South Carolina and Maryland – has helped me grow in professional and creative ways. I have dabbled in the spiritual, intellectual, organizational, inspirational and imaginative in these last 25 years. I have led synagogues, learned with other rabbis, lay leaders and congregants, been the “rabbi” to a whole geographic region for the URJ in the Southeast, and have touched many lives. What a blessing! I count them every day.

As May begins, I am also aware that my partnership with Har Sinai Congregation is changing. I have six more weeks of onsite work at our beautiful building in Owings Mills. Richard and I are fortunate that I have found another job in Maryland which allows us to stay in our home. As of July 1, I will become the rabbi of another Reform Jewish Congregation, Bet Aviv in Columbia. It is a wonderful synagogue, which meets in the Oakland Mills Interfaith Center, forging some unique synergies and alliances with other faith traditions, and in that it is a congregation with an adult focus.

The connections I have created with you, my Har Sinai congregants and family, will always be special to me. Since Richard and I will be remaining in in the area, I am sure our paths will cross. Whether at community events, Costco, the park, or Facebook, there will always be a connection forged by the winding road of these last three years, and it will always be wonderful to see you.

Between Pesach and Shavuot, the Israelites wandered in the wilderness, which we acknowledge during the Counting of the Omer. Their path had highs like Mount Sinai and lows like the Golden Calf. But ultimately, the Promised Land lay ahead. That focus, how to live in the Promised Land, takes up half of Exodus, and much of the books of Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy.

Har Sinai Congregation is wandering in a time of wilderness. I know that the Interim Rabbi Search Committee is working diligently to find you an Interim Rabbi that will help you traverse the many changes in our historic and beautiful congregation as you shape your Promised Land. Whether you merge with Temple Oheb Shalom, or whether you become a new Har Sinai, know that all journeys are filled with twists and turns and can always be framed as blessings.

It is the month of May. May our experiences, personal and communal, bring us to new places, new vistas, and fill us ultimately with blessing, wholeness and peace.

The Board expressed interest in seeing greater representation from Posner JEM parents on the Board of Trustees. Ken agreed to make this a priority in potential presidential nominations, of which he is allowed two.

Rabbi Search Update

Debbi Jacobs said she was hopeful about Rabbi Katz, the third interim candidate who visited the congregation April 9-11. Should he arrive over the summer, a first priority is giving him time to meet with September b'nai mitzvah families.

2019-20 Budget Discussion

The budget was approved by the Board of Trustees, though a recommendation was made to reduce the amount of projected dues income by \$100,000 for 2019-20. This change was accepted and approved.

Discussions with Temple Oheb Shalom

Barbara Schlaff provided an overview of issues discussed with TOS in the last three months since the Joint Task Force started meeting (summarized in the Town Hall Fact Sheet distributed on 4/28).

The Board of Trustees passed a unanimous vote of confidence in the merger with TOS.
